Each spring, the Connecticut Council of Language Teachers is pleased to recognize and reward the excellence and achievement of deserving World Language students at all levels of instruction across the state by offering the **CT COLT Award for Excellence in World Languages**. Students from your school, whose names appear on the accompanying sheet, have been selected by their language teachers to receive this award. Through their achievement, they bring honor to themselves as well as to their teachers and school.

In order to qualify for this award, a student enrolled in a World Language class at the elementary, middle or high school level of instruction must demonstrate excellence as indicated by an average equivalent to 90 or above, for three consecutive marking periods this year in the same language. These students must also give evidence of a positive attitude toward language and cultures by using the language beyond the classroom and/or participating in language clubs. Since each teacher may select no more than five students, only a select group of worthy students may receive the **CT COLT Award for Excellence**.

All students selected for this award receive a special certificate from the Connecticut Council of Language Teachers and will have their names published in the **Connecticut Council of Language Teachers News Exchange**. In addition, students in Level IV and higher of language study receive a medal engraved with "**For Excellence in World Languages**".

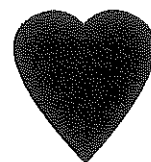
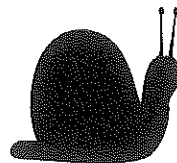
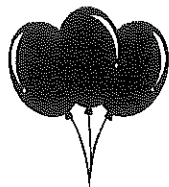
